## Cheerful block for a scrap happy quilt

What do you do with all the scraps you save? "Use them!" declares Bonnie. In every issue, find Bonnie's ideas for making blocks from your leftovers in Addicted to Scraps.

Scrappy Hourglass blocks combined with strips of different widths give fun movement to this block. I used my 11/2" and 2" strips for this block.

I cut the quarter-square triangles (A) from 2" strips using the Companion Angle ruler. You can also cut them from 41/4" squares that are cut in half diagonally twice.

Notice that 2 of the Hourglass units have patches that are 11/2"-wide (B and C) sewn on 2 sides first followed by 2"-wide patches (D and E), while the other 2 units have 2"-wide patches (F and G) sewn first followed by the  $1\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide patches (H and I). This leaves fewer seams to match when joining the block quadrants together and also adds some fractured motion to the quilt design. 🚹

# cutting

Finished Block: 11" For one block, cut the following:

### **4 Light Fabrics**

from each:

1 square 41/4" x 41/4" cut diagonally twice to yield 4 triangles (A)  $\boxtimes$ (there will be 2 extra triangles from each fabric)

### 4 Assorted Medium/Dark Fabrics from each:

1 square 41/4" x 41/4" cut diagonally twice to yield 4 triangles (A) (there will be 2 extra triangles from each fabric)


#### **Assorted Medium/Dark Fabrics**

- 2 rectangles (B) 11/2" x 31/2"
- 2 rectangles (C) 11/2" x 41/2"
- 2 rectangles (D) 2" x 41/2"
- 2 rectangles (E) 2"x 6"
- 2 rectangles (F) 2" x 31/2"
- 2 rectangles (G) 2"x 5"
- 2 rectangles (H) 11/2" x 5"
- 2 rectangles (I) 11/2" x 6"
